Welcome to our Sunday Services

A warm welcome to everyone joining us at St Mary Magdalen this week, especially if you are here for the first time or visiting. Our worship follows the printed order of service and the readings and hymns are on an additional sheet. Large print versions are available from the sidespersons (the welcomers at the door). If you are using a hearing aid, please switch it to the T position so as to make best use of the hearing loop system. It is traditional to stand for the hymns and some of the prayers and readings, but if this is difficult for you then please do remain seated and comfortable.

In the entrance area are toilets, and there is a crèche area at the back of the church. During the service there are activities in the entrance area for children of all ages, at Sunday Club.

As part of each service we share Communion together and everyone is invited to come forwards to receive bread and wine as we remember the sacrifice of Jesus Christ. If you would prefer to come for a blessing then simply carry the service booklet with you. At 10.00am, non-alcoholic communion wine is available on request in the Lady Chapel (to the left) and gluten free wafers on request at the main Communion rail.

Please talk to the sidespersons if you have any other questions and do please stay after the service for tea or coffee and introduce yourself to some of us.

"What should we do?"

Repent and be baptised in the name of Jesus Christ....." Two weeks ago we looked at the first of our 'Kingdom Questions' from the Acts of the Apostles. We were reminded that after the resurrection St Peter called on all those who believed in Jesus as Lord and Saviour to begin a new way of life, and to publically affirm their Christian faith. If you've already been baptised then you may be wondering how you can demonstrate your commitment as a Christian in response to this call. In the Church of England one way to do this is to be 'confirmed'. This happens in a church service when the Bishop prays for each confirmation candidate, that your faith be confirmed by the gift of the Holy Spirit. If you would be interested in exploring the possibility of confirmation for yourself, then please talk to either Adrian or Neil, our clergy. There will be a Deanery Confirmation Service at St Andrew's, Aylestone on Sunday 17th September.

Looking Back and Looking Ahead.
