- At 10.00am, non-alcoholic communion wine is available on request in the Lady Chapel (to the left) and gluten free wafers on request at the main Communion rail.

"Darkness Falls" - a dramatic telling of John's Gospel: The acclaimed Saltmine Theatre Company are bringing their latest production to Leicester on Thursday 15th March, 7.30pm, at the Tudor Grange Samworth Academy, Trenant Road (also the home of St Christopher's Church, Saffron Lane). "Darkness Falls" is a remarkable re-imagining of the Gospel of John and is, by turns, moving, funny, poetic and fantastical. The production mixes vivid storytelling with beautiful live music to bring us a timeless story as we've never seen it before.

This gritty performance (suitable for teenagers upwards) is a compelling introduction to John's Gospel for those with little Christian background and also a fresh and provocative retelling for those of us who know the New Testament well. During the day they will be performing to all the Year 10 pupils at the Academy. It is therefore exactly the sort of initiative that St Mary's should be supporting. #### **Mothering Sunday**

During the sixteenth century, people returned to their mother church for a service on the fourth Sunday of Lent, also called "Laetare Sunday". In this context, the mother church could be the church where they had been baptised, or their local parish church, or the nearest cathedral (the latter being the "mother church" of all parish churches in a diocese). Anyone who did this was said to have gone "a-mothering", although whether the term preceded the observance of Mothering Sunday is unclear.

In later times, Mothering Sunday became a date when domestic servants were given a day off to visit their mother church, usually with their own mothers and family members. It was often the only time that whole families could gather together, since on other days they were prevented from doing so by conflicting working hours and servants were not given free days on other festivals. Children and young people "in service" would pick wild flowers along the way to place in church or give to their mothers.

Eventually the religious tradition evolved into the Mothering Sunday secular tradition of giving gifts to mothers. Mother's Day has always been a secular event quite separate from the original Mothering Sunday.

#### **CONFIRMATION SERVICE**

Is this your next step on the journey of faith? It may be that for a while now you've been thinking about our Christian faith and have a feeling that you should take another step forwards....and that step could be 'confirmation.' In the Church of England, the service of confirmation is a chance to 'confirm' that the promises made on your behalf at baptism (often when you were a baby) are now your promises too - a clear intention to follow Jesus in a life of faith.

A confirmation service is always taken by a Bishop and often includes 'candidates' from several churches. You can be confirmed at any age, as long as your supporting Minister has spent some time with you first talking about the basics of Christianity and your faith. Our next local confirmation service is at the Cathedral on Easter Saturday (31st March) at 6pm so if you'd like to join others in thinking more about this next step on your journey of faith do please let Adrian know as soon as you can (0116 270 4268 adrian.jones@zoho.com).

## "We will remember them"

These are words we say every year. This year is the centenary of Armistice Day. St Mary's will be hosting a number of events from 7th - 11th November. From poppies, both real and knitted, to displays of photographs and the printed histories of some of the men whose names are on the memorial in the Lady Chapel. During the year the names of those who fell during 1918 will be read out at a Sunday service, nearest their death.

There will an invited speaker on the morning of the 8th November, educational visits will be offered plus an Open Church weekend where light refreshments will be available. The week will culminate with a combined service with St Guthlac at St Mary's at 5pm 11th November.

How can you help? In lots of ways. Knit poppies or scour your loft for any artefacts or photographs of people who had an association with Knighton during 1914 -1918. There is a list at the back of church of who is doing what to make this joint event with St Guthlac something we will remember for a long time.

#### REMEMBERING THE FALLEN IN 2018, THE CENTENARY OF THE END OF THE GREAT WAR.

During 2018 we will be remembering all those local soldiers who died during the last year of the Great War, exactly one hundred years ago. Each soldier will be mentioned by name in our prayers on the Sunday closest to the anniversary of his death.

**REMEMBER TODAY** Second Lieutenant Ellis Arthur Bowes, 4th Bn, Leicestershire Regiment, who died on 12th March 1918, aged 19 years. Son of Richard and Kitty Bowes, of Portland Towers, Stoneygate, Leicester, he was killed in action and buried at the time in Epehy New British Cemetery, and is commemorated at the Epehy Wood Farm Cemetery on the Somme in France.


**Church Wardens** have a part in overseeing all aspects of the growth and development of our Church life, as well as it's day to day running. The key elements of their role are:

<u>But that does not mean they have to do everything themselves!</u> We are fortunate in having a large and experienced team of people who are already committed to many aspects of church life, and a group of former Church Wardens and Deputy Wardens who are happy to assist and give advice.

**PCC members** meet together to share their understanding of our church life and needs, to offer constructive advice and questions to the Wardens and Vicar, and to make decisions about some important policies and procedures. Each PCC member brings their own skills and experience and it is healthy therefore to have a good mix and balance of gender, age and background amongst our PCC.

If you have even the smallest thought that one of these roles might be for you, then please do talk to Adrian, Neil, Patrick or Ros (the current Wardens) or to a member of the PCC, so that we can encourage you and answer any questions.
