# COMING UP ...... What's happening at St Mary's on Sundays in January/February 2025

Our 10.30am Sunday services at St Mary's vary, week by week – we hope that this provides different types of worship that appeal in different ways and, perhaps, are appreciated by different groups of people. Everyone is welcome every week!

In January this year, our Sunday sermons follow the theme "All is revealed!"

- On Sunday 19<sup>th</sup> January we will share Morning Worship at 10.30am.
   We'll be thinking about the wedding in Cana "Glory Revealed and Grace Rediscovered"
- Our final Sunday in January, 26<sup>th</sup>, will again be a service of Sung Eucharist. Today we remember Jesus's own revelation that he is the promised Messiah.
- The new month begins with All Age Worship on Sunday 2<sup>nd</sup>
   February when we mark Candlemas with a service for the whole church together.
- On Sunday **9**<sup>th</sup> **February** in our service of Sung Eucharist, we pick up the theme of "*Learning with Luke*" as we consider different aspects of Jesus' work and teaching as it applies to our regular lives today.
- The third Sunday of the month is 16<sup>th</sup> February and our Morning Worship continues to focus on Luke's Gospel.
- On Sunday 23<sup>rd</sup> February we celebrate with a Sung Eucharist once more, as we continue "Learning with Luke."
- As usual, **each Sunday** our quieter, **Weekly Eucharist**, takes place at 9am, with 'traditional language' on the second and fourth Sundays of the month. Our weekly midweek Communion is on Tuesdays at 9.30am, and on the last Friday of each month, at 11am, we hold a Service of Prayer for Healing, with Holy Communion.

**Wednesday Small Group** - please note that our Wednesday morning small group, that meets in the Parish Centre, is having a short break. We'll start again for Lent - beginning on Wednesday 5th March. *Adrian* 


