ABOUT OUR SERVICES

- Our worship follows the printed order of service and the readings and hymns are on an additional sheet. Large print versions are available from the sidespersons (the welcomers at the door).
- If you are using a hearing aid, please switch it to the T position so as to make best use of the hearing loop system.
- It is traditional to stand for the hymns and some of the prayers and readings, but if this is difficult for you then please do remain seated and comfortable.
- In the entrance area are toilets, and there is a crèche area at the back of the church.
- During the service there are activities in the entrance area for children of all ages, at Sunday Club.
- As part of each service we share Communion together and everyone is invited to come forwards to receive bread and wine as we remember the sacrifice of Jesus Christ. If you would prefer to come for a blessing then simply carry the service booklet with you.
- At 10.00am, non-alcoholic communion wine is available on request in the Lady Chapel (to the left) and gluten free wafers on request at the main Communion rail.
- Please talk to the sidespersons if you have any other questions and do please stay after the 10.00 am service for tea or coffee and introduce yourself to some of us.

CHURCH SPIRE UPDATE: Many of you will remember that we have been advised to have repair work done on the church spire and the Buildings Group have been trying to find ways of bringing down the prospective cost, which might be between £150-200,000. A Specialist Consulting Engineer has recently advised that the repairs need to be made with 'moderate urgency' and will certainly require the scaffolding which makes up the bulk of the cost. We can now ask the Church Architect to draw up the specifications for the work, which in turn will allow us to make applications to grant-making bodies and ultimately to invite tenders from specialist building repair companies. I am grateful to Paul Bonnett for pursuing these grant applications for us. We will give you regular updates on our progress. *Adrian*

CHURCHYARD MATTERS: The PCC had a good discussion about all the issues connected to the maintenance of the churchyard by the City Council and what we need to do now in order to improve things.

The maintenance is their responsibility and not done under a contract to us, so we need to proceed through diplomatic discussion. We will be asking for much more information about the standards that the Council are working to and the frequency and nature of the work that they will do over the course of each year.

We will be clarifying the roles that volunteers can play in churchyard maintenance, especially in attending to weeds on individual graves, which technically are the responsibility of families rather than Church or Council. These weeds need to be controlled by spraying in the near future, so if you know of families with loved ones in the 'modern' part of the churchyard (to the south/right of the main drive as you approach the church) perhaps you could let them know of our intention.

If you would like to join our 'churchyard champions' in working to make things better please do let Neil know so that you can be included in emails and meetings. Many thanks for everyone's patience and understanding as we work to improve the churchyard. *Adrian*

'SUSPENDED' Leicester Cathedral This is a stunning and deeply moving installation by the distinguished war artist Arabella Dorman, composed of 700 pieces of clothing discarded by refugees on their arrival at the Greek island of Lesbos. Leicester is privileged to host this installation, which was first shown in St James', Piccadilly and later in Canterbury Cathedral. Viewing is free, during Cathedral opening times, and continues until 28th August.

TOILET TWINNING Thank you for your response to the appeal. We raised **£203.41** which, with gift aid, will make £240.91 for the cause – more than enough to twin our three loos at St. Mary's. Our handsome framed certificates should arrive soon and if people ask what they mean, please explain that we are helping people to have access to a proper, safe latrine, clean water and the information they need to be healthy. 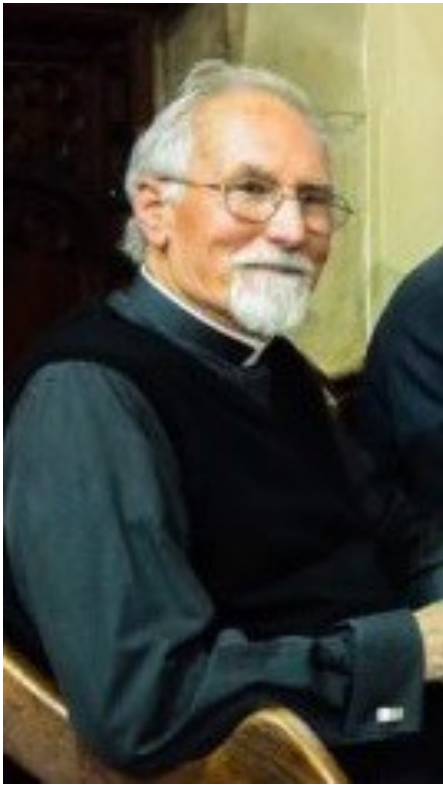
WISDOM FROM THE WORLD CHURCH
